Holiday Food Baskets:

WCAP offers the Heroes 4 Hunger program, which provides Thanksgiving and Christmas food boxes to families in Waldo County. Residents who are in need of a food basket need to fill out an application, beginning in October, available at the WCAP Fuel Assistance Office, Waldo County Head Start, your town office or child’s school. Meals on Wheels:

Spectrum Generations Meals on Wheels program provides nutritionally balanced hot meals for homebound individuals. This is available to any homebound individual 60 years of age or older and to persons with a disability which limits their ability to prepare a meal. Meals on Wheels are delivered to your front door. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides food assistance benefits that help low-income households buy the food they need for good health. In order to qualify, you must have an annual household income (before taxes) that is below the following amounts:

Women Infants & Children (WIC)

WIC is a nutrition program for thousands of Maine families, helping Maine kids to grow up strong and healthy. WIC food benefits are available based on income guidelines (listed below) and up-to-date nutrition research. The WIC website seeks to serve all Maine families with free nutrition advice, tips for staying healthy, and resources.

Applicants for the WIC program can be any of the following:

- Women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or had a baby in the last six months;
- Infants and children up to the age of five, including adopted and foster children;
- Fathers may apply for their children.
